Q. What is the focus of this class?

A. We are continually trying to figure out why the United States is the way it is, why the world is the way it is and how history relates to what we are doing today.

Q. How do you help students learn these skills?

A. We do a lot of reading and writing that revolves around U.S. History. We do hands on projects, role playing, poster work, working in teams and oral presentations using PowerPoint.

Q. Describe a project students have worked on recently.

A. We just finished a unit on the U.S. Constitution. The students researched current issues and came up with debate topics and outlines. They then argued on these current issues.

Q. How does studying song lyrics help students learn more about poetry?

A. Song lyrics help students see the deeper meaning in the words. It makes them take a closer look at the writing rather than just skimming over it. They soon realize song lyrics are just poetry set to music. It's a very popular project.
