



# Walla Walla Public Schools Classroom Close-Up

Q. Why are you using an online program for your 7th grade RTI math class?

A. These students are below grade level and have a lot of holes with their math skills. In a regular math classroom they really struggle. We are using an individualized, web-based program called ALEKS (Assessment and Learning in Knowledge Spaces) to provide the support they need to be successful.

ALEKS uses adaptive questioning to quickly and accurately determine exactly what a student knows and doesn't know. There are 219 topics for 7th grade students to master and it only gives them the ones they are ready to learn. As they master some, then others show up. The students don't get frustrated because they are only working on materials they understand.

Q. What kind of results are you seeing?

A. Kids are adding two or three years of growth in just one school year based on their STAR testing. One of the best parts of the program is the students are gaining confidence. When we first started, my students had difficulty choosing a topic without help. Now they are becoming self-motivated learners.

Q. How is technology improving learning opportunities?

A. It's tremendous. We couldn't do this program without it. The kids love using their Chromebooks. It's less intimidating than having to be called on by the teacher to answer questions in front of the whole class. With this program, only the computer knows if they answered correctly and it lets them know immediately if the answer was right or wrong. I am so thankful we have our own set of Chromebooks for this class with a printer. Each student gets their own homework printed each week. The homework is individualized so each student has a different set of assignments.
